

Eastern Gateway Community College Criminal Justice Associate of Applied Science (AAS)

To fulfill the MDOC's 15 credits you must take any 5 of the following courses. However, if you choose to complete the full CJ AAS degree, you must take all the following courses:

CJT 202 Criminal Investigation	3 credits
CJT 210 Introduction to Criminal Law	3 credits
CJT 213 Police Function	3 credits
CJT 222 Homeland Security	3 credits
COR 203 Criminology	3 credits
COR 205 Juvenile Delinquency	3 credits
PSY 101 General Psychology	3 credits
SOC 101 Introduction to Sociology	3 credits

**Completion of 15 semester (23 term) college credits in one or a combination of the following: correctional administration, criminal justice, criminology, psychology, social work, sociology, counseling and guidance, educational psychology, family relations, pastoral counseling, or law enforcement.

**Employees have up to 18 months after date of hire to satisfy this requirement. Employees will not proceed to the E9-level until satisfactory completion of the education requirement. Completion of the education requirement is required in order to remain employed.

The following credits toward the CJ AAS degree at EGCC will be fulfilled upon completing the MDOC Corrections Officer Academy. You do not need to take any of these courses:
