Doug Best, an investigator with the Absconder Recovery Unit, went to a doctor in March 2016 for leg pain.

The doctor found a blood clot in his leg, and a blood test revealed he had leukemia. Best started chemotherapy and radiation. In September 2016, he had a bone marrow transplant. He was hospitalized for about a month.

Best is a former CO at Saginaw Correctional Facility and a former parole agent. He used to be assigned to the absconder recovery office in charge of Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties. He transferred to Grand Rapids shortly before his diagnosis.

Best has friends around the state who supported him during his time of need.

"It meant a lot to me. People showed up, and MCO stepped up right away," Best said.

The MCO Crisis Fund and MDOC staff fundraisers helped defray the cost of his hospital stay, medications, and weekly drives to Ann Arbor for treatment.

Best is working on gaining weight and strength so he can return to work.



An inmate used improvised weapons – padlocks inside of a sock and a shank – in an attack on Corrections Officer Kevin Ott.

Ott and one other officer were alone in a Saginaw Correctional Facility housing unit with 240 inmates at the time of the assault. Ott suffered a broken rib and his right lung collapsed. A piece of his skull broke off, and a blood clot developed on his brain.

Officers and MCO leaders stepped up to help Ott. Crisis Fund money was donated to Ott, and MCO chapters around the state held fundraisers for him.

"Right after I got hurt, I literally got hundreds of emails from staff around the state," Ott said. "They're just great, the people in corrections ... They were very thoughtful. I'm very grateful for what they did. And most of the people, I don't even know."
